Currently serves as Executive Director of the Franklin H. Williams Judicial Commission, a state-wide commission which seeks to educate and advise decision makers in the New York Court System on issues affecting both employees and litigants of color and to implement recommendations developed to address said issues. Mary Lynn has been a member of the Rockland Orange Chapter of Jack and Jill of America, Inc., for 12 years and currently serves as the Chapter's president.



## Nicole Gladden-Mathews, Esq.

Currently practices Law at one of the nation's top law firms. As part of her pro bono activities, Ms. Matthews has worked with Volunteer Lawyers for the Arts, Housing Works and MENTOR moot court, which exposes inner city youth to the practice of law through a moot court competition run by the Justice Resource Center. In 2009, Ms. Matthews joined the Center for Safety and Change (CSS) (formerly Rockland Family Shelter) as an advocate and Coordinator for Services to the African-American Community. While there, she helped advocate for survivors of domestic violence and created a model for a teen group that would later become Spring Valley Leaders of Tomorrow, which she co-facilitated through the end of its tenure.
